

Lectures Online - How to access echo's

Lectures Online is not offered for all unit's - check with your lecturer to see if recordings have been scheduled for your unit/s.

Navigate to the Lecture Online echo link on your unit's vUWS site and decide which format you would like to choose. There are 3 options:

- Stream audio and video to your computer or mobile device.
- Download Audio to your computer or mobile device.
- Download Video to your computer or mobile device.

Streamed Media

On clicking the link to access the streamed media a new window will open. The new window will provide you the opportunity to customise your view experience. You have the ability choose from a high quality "Broadband" or the lower quality "Dial In". You also have the option to view the "Screen Reader" optimised version.

The window also give you the option to customise the appearance of your player. You can choose from either a Dark or Light player.


When you have finished customising your view experience select "Launch Player"

Navigating the EchoPlayer

The EchoPlayer offers a number of features that allows you to easily navigate your way through an echo. You can perform a keyword search, select an individual scene, use the slider or skip through scenes to find the section of the echo you would like to review.
